

Somogyaszaló honfoglalás kori temető embertani vizsgálata
Anthropological Analysis of the 10th Century cemetery from Somogyaszaló (in Hungarian)

Abstract: 13 graves from the Hungarian Conquest period cemetery were excavated by Erdélyi in Somogyaszaló in 1966. In total, the skeletal remains of 13 graves were examined in this study. In the course of the anthropological study the sex, age of death, morphological traits and pathological changes were examined, and the skull and long bones were measured. According to the examination, 5 males, 5 females, 3 children and 1 juvenile girl were buried into the excavated part of the cemetery. On the basis of the morphological and metrical analyses all the people of the cemetery belonged to the euroid taxonomical group, but some of them bore a few features that may suggest a possible linkage to populations of Eastern origin.
